GUILD POINTS (iPoints)

Students will have many opportunities to be rewarded with Guild Points (iPoints) for their **academic progress, personal development** and their contributions to the **community** ethos of the school.

At the end of the school year, students will be awarded with certificates in the final celebration assembly. The Guild which has accumulated the highest number of Guild Points will also be awarded the Guild Cup.

Below are **some** of the ways students can earn Guild Points in the three categories.

Teachers may issue Guild Points for other achievements which are not listed here:

Achievements in the above categories will attract 1 or 2 Guild Points. Overcoming an exceptional personal challenge and successful completion of the Duke of Edinburgh award will earn up to 10 Guild Points.

COMMUNITY:	
1. Always being on time in the morning	1 Guild Point per week
2. Always wearing your uniform in the correct manner	1 Guild Point per week
3. Regular attendance at a club	Up to 5 Guild Points per term
4. Regular attendance at school choir	Up to 5 Guild Points per term
5. Representing your tutor group	Up to 5 Guild Points
6. Contributing to charity	Up to 5 Guild Points
7. Acts of kindness / helpfulness	Up to 5 Guild Points
8. Taking a pro-active role in assembly	5 Guild Points
9. Contributing to tutor group worship	Up to 10 Guild Points
10. Representing the school	Up to 10 Guild Points each time
11. Participation in open evening	10 Guild Points

RED POINTS – INCOMPLETE HOMEWORK

Students can be given a red point for not completing homework as well as a sanction from the subject teacher.

ORANGE POINTS – EQUIPMENT

Students can be given an orange point for not having the correct equipment in a lesson.

YELLOW POINTS – UNIFORM

Students can be given a yellow point for failing to wear the correct uniform.

In year 11, Guild Points will contribute towards the students' graduation. The Bennett graduation course is a celebration of success, a certified course to both encourage and acknowledge every aspect of development, designed to help to focus year 11 students on what they need to do to enjoy success.

In year 11, the following additional criteria for reward apply in addition to those listed above:

Being a prefect	Up to 5 Community Guild Points per term
Being a member of the social team	Up to 5 Guild Points

Students in Year 11 will also be awarded RE points, which contribute towards their graduation.
