#### Pupil Destinations:

Pupil destination data is published by the DFE two years after students have left the school. Currently these data are about students reaching the end of 16 to 18 study in 2020 and staying in education or employment for at least 2 terms after this.

Pupils who stayed in education or went into employment after Year 13 - 88%. This is 10% higher than the local authority average.

### Pupil Destinations:

Pupil destination data is published by the DfE two years after students have left the school. These data are about students reaching the end of Key Stage 4 study in 2020 and staying in education or employment for at least 2 terms after this.

Pupils who stayed in education or went into employment for at least 2 terms after Year 11 - **99%**. This is 4% higher than the local authority average.
